Scoping workshop - University of Southampton: 27 February, 2013 Plans and notes

Aim: to examine the extent to which IT as a Utility underpins the Digital Economy.

Outcome: to establish a working framework with which the ITaaU Network+ can further investigate the question through workshops, pilot projects, secondments and other actions. By framework we mean a succinct scoping of the events and actions needed to move forward with the Network. This would include the key themes to be covered by the workshops, technologies and issues that pilot projects should cover and domains that secondments should cover. The framework should also encompass the optimal communication channels that the network should embrace from video clips, reports and website.

Questions:

- What do we understand by Digital Economy?
- How do we differentiate between Utility and Service in the context of IT?
- How does the Platform Model relate to ITaaU?
- What are the key technologies available or applicable to become utilities?
- What is the audience that we should be targeting?
- What is the global scope of this activity?
- What are the dominant business models contributing to the growth of the Digital Economy from an IT perspective? Ie. What roles do academia, big business, Government, SMEs and VCs play?

Comments:

Tightly scoped literature surveys have been produced, 2 so far -

- IT as a Utility same as utility computing
- 1974 first utterance by Nicholas Carr in Harvard Business Review contentious

Other utilities have standards, regulations etc however, IT looses its benefits if tied down too far

- Application utilities have emerged as powerful and inherently different to the outsourced
- Trade magazines could be a good stating point for getting the more general message out.

How do we spark a debate?

Key terms to address are: utility, usability and usefulness

RCUK and DE - what dissemination channels do they have?

- Cross-disciplinary channels?
- We could have a role as the news channel
- We have to know the market who reads what?
- Compile data with web site analysis

Spice Trade - metaphor - work with Roger and the New Economic sub-theme - workshop? oil? How to value the data you have as a commodity? Bogdan, how could this be used to value companies Tyrannies of the past tried to force people to give data

Workshop on Data Science (Bogdan) leading to data products. August? 'Predictive analysis' - where is the gold?

We should focus on producing a report.

Target audience? Advisory Group brings in companies; we also need users, local councils? researchers?

Aim: the goal is to stimulate new thinking.

There is much activity in this area but we need to go further.

Data is now challenging traditionally qualitative research. Eg social networking, social sciences, social machines, scale of investigations now possible but requires diverse skills sets. Data Science - new role - but, not engineering or computer science, what about within social science. Different to stats.
