OPEN EXHIBITION

At Y Lie Celf at Anglesey a multi media exhibition will be held. Applications in both fine and applied art (including the moving image and performance art) are welcome.

Entrants are requested to submit work in the form of high quality Jpeg images accompanied by a clear statement concerning the work. Because of the large number of entries most of the works will be selected from these images, therefore it is important to submit clear images of your work and to show items that are available for the exhibition. Entrants who work through the medium of the moving image or performance are invited to present their work on DVD. After viewing the entries, the selectors may request further material. Also a small number of those short-listed for the exhibition may be visited by the selectors. The selected works will be displayed in Y Lle Celf for the duration of the Eisteddfod. Where the work necessitates, it may happen other than in the building itself.

CRAFT AND DESIGN THE GOLD MEDAL FOR CRAFT AND DESIGN

Prize: The Gold Medal for Craft and Design (replica) and £5,000 to be awarded at the discretion of the selectors.

YOUNG ARTIST SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship: £1,500 (Loveday Street Church, Birmingham) The scholarship will be awarded to the most promising candidate to enable him/her to pursue a course in a recognised school or college of art and design or attend master classes. The scholarship is open to those under 25 years at the time of the Eisteddfod. Short-listed candidates will be expected to prepare a portfolio of work and submit a letter of application describing how the scholarship will be put to use. The work submitted may be displayed in Y Lle Celf. The successful candidate may also be offered space at the following Eisteddfod's Lle Celf to display his/her work.

1. Who is eligible to compete?

The exhibition is open to any person born in Wales, or with one of their parents born in Wales or any person resident or working in Wales for the three years prior to 4 August 2017 or any person able to speak or write the Welsh language.

2. Entry fees and forms

The entry fee is £20.00 (£10.00 Young Artist Scholarship). Entrants are invited to send in six 300 dpi, A5 size, Jpeg images on CD or USB (PC compatible) that show one work or a cross-section of works. Each entry is limited to a maximum of six images. Entrants who work through the medium of the moving image or performance are invited to present up to six works on DVD or USB. Links to video hosting sites can also be accepted. To be eligible for selection, every entrant must include some work completed since August 2014. After viewing the entries, the selectors may request further material.

3. Statement

A full statement concerning the submitted work must also be enclosed - applications submitted without an accompanying statement will not be considered.

4. How to enter
